**Containers:** Plastics #1-7, Metal and Glass

- \$ 1 Minimum charge  
\$ 2 Plastic bin / garbage bag

**Mixed Paper:** including Fiber Board Boxes

**NO** tissues, paper towels, hardcover  
books, plastic bags, used cups/plates

- \$ 1 Minimum charge  
\$ 2 Plastic bin / kitchen bag  
\$ 8/ bulk  
cu.yd.

**Corrugated Cardboard:** Flattened / empty

- \$ 2 Minimum charge  
\$ 5 car full  
\$ 8/ truck full - bulk  
cu.yd.

**Batteries**

- \$ 3 lead acid  
\$20 mixed household - bucket

## Reuse Items

**MUST BE SHELF READY: IN GOOD  
CONDITION, CLEAN, AND ODOR FREE!**

The regular fee will be charged to cover  
potential disposal cost even if the item is in  
good condition. The check-in volunteer will  
direct you to where an item should be taken  
for reuse or disposal.

- Current Holiday, Seasonal only
- Arts and crafts, school supplies
- Fabric, yarn, sewing, knitting supplies
- Toys, stuffed animals, puzzles, games
- Dishes, pans, appliances (\$), utensils, art,  
vases
- Clean metal, plastic and glass containers  
with lids. NO takeout containers
- Packing peanuts **in bags**
- Sporting goods: shoes, boots, helmets
- Accessories: hats, scarves, gloves,  
mittens, purses, backpacks, luggage
- Books. NO mold or mildew
- Entertainment: cds, dvds, records
- Office supplies
- Cards and gift wrap
- Home medical equipment, NO electronic
- Tools(\$), hardware, building supplies(\$)
- Eyeglasses
- Bicycles
- Electronics (\$), wires/cables
- Deposit/returnable bottles and cans
- Clean and dry clothing and textiles:  
linens, blankets, curtains, shoes, etc.
